Ground Breaking

The Ground Breaking Ceremony for our new house of worship was held after the morning worship service, April 28, 1957. Rev. Geiger read the ground breaking rite, and John Zillman, chairman of the Building Committee, and Ed Kaelke, president of the congregation, turned the first shovelful of earth.

A gift of \$6,047.50 was given to Immanuel Lutheran Church by the Central Illinois District of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League at the annual convention, June 5, 1957.

Cornerstone Laying

Due to inclement weather, a special service was not held. On June 11, 1957, the following items were placed into the cornerstone by the chairman of the Building Committee, John Zillman, and Rev. Geiger – a New Testament, A Catechism, most recent copies of the Lutheran Witness and District supplement, a Macomb Daily Journal, a list containing the names of the church officers, the Building Committee, the builder, the pastor, the President of the Country, the Governor of Illinois, and the Mayor of Macomb, as well as a brief history of the congregation.
